
Agile



A flexible method of software development project management, which divides work into small sections and allows for constant re-evaluation.




Blockchain



A digital ledger of transactions that is distributed (which means that every participant in a given system has a copy and access to the chain). It is extremely difficult for any singular party to tamper with, as discrepancies are immediately obvious. Blockchain underpins Bitcoin (a digital currency) and is also used in supply chains as transactions aren't recognised until they are added to the chain.



Cloud



The ability to access data over the internet, rather than relying on a physical device or hard drive.





Drones



An unmanned aircraft that can be flown autonomously and beyond the line of sight.







Network



A group of two or more computers that are connected to each other is known as a network.



Open Source



If a piece of software is 'open source', then this means that the source code is freely available to the public.







An attempt at obtaining sensitive information through forged emails and websites to gain access to your personal information.





QR Code



A 'quick response code' is a barcode that can be scanned by a smartphone with a camera which is then de-coded and converted to show the information behind it e.g. open a website or it could contain your boarding pass





Raspberry Pi



A small credit card sized computer which can be used for programming.





Software As A Service (SAAS)



Software distribution model where software applications are centrally hosted, deployed over the internet and licensed to users on a recurring subscription/pay as you use basis. Users only need a computer with a browser to be able to access SAAS.



Tokenisation



Replacing sensitive data e.g. credit card information with a token (identifiable symbols) that protects the information but doesn't compromise its security.





USB port



The most common type of computer port. You can use it to connect keyboards, printers, digital cameras etc.
